O.A.U. SCALE OF ASSESSMENT

The Council at its last meeting adopted resolution CM/93(VIII) directing that the Secretariat should obtain from Member States some national economic data on which the Secretariat should work out a more equitable scale of assessment. In pursuance of that resolution, the Secretariat requested Member States to supply the required statistics and the results of the exercise is contained in document CM/160 and all its appendices. It could be seen that many Member States have not yet submitted their figures to the Secretariat as required by the resolution.

In the effort to comply with the terms of the resolution, the Secretariat had found it very difficult to use the figures in formulating a scale of assessment. This difficulty has been mentioned in document CM/160 and was fully explained to the Advisory Committee on Budgetary and Financial matters at its Fourth Ordinary Session in Bathurst. It is not easy to use these data obtained from the Member States in the construction of a scale of assessment which would be regarded by majority of the Member States as fair. For instance a country with a total national high income and high population figure may show a lower per capita income than a country with a relatively lower total national income and relatively smaller population. Thus national income per capita may not reflect the relative wealth of any two or more countries. It is therefore not considered a fair and equitable basis of assessing the capacity of Member States to pay their contributions to the Organization.

The Secretariat had explained these difficulties to the Advisory Committee and as a result, the Committee has recommended that only two elements be now taken into consideration in the formulation of an OAU Scale of Assessment. These elements are to be net national product and total population. The recommendation of the Advisory Committee in this direction will be found in the report

of the Rapporteur and if the Council approves, the Secretariat will then proceed on the basis of these two elements to formulate a new scale of assessment. Member States will help the Secretariat greatly if the various economic data required by resolution CM/93(VIII) could be made available to the Secretariat as early as possible. It will then be easier to calculate these two elements in respect of each Member State for the year 1965 as recommended by the Committee and then possibly arrive at what may be regarded by majority of the Member States as equitable scale of assessment.

Document CM/160 and information received from Member States as of 11th August, 1967 are attached to this document.

The Administrative Secretary-General would be grateful if Their Excellencies would forward the information described in the Resolution to the General Secretariat at Their earliest convenience. It would be appreciated if the information requested would be forwarded so as to reach the General Secretariat by 31st May, 1967. In addition to the above information it would be appreciated if Their Excellencies would also forward to the Secretariat figures showing the net national product.

The Administrative Secretary-General of the Organization of African Unity avails himself of this opportunity to renew to Their Excellencies the assurances of his highest consideration."

The replies received to this letter are attached as appendices to this document.

As replies have not been received from all Member States it is not possible to propose a new scale of assessment as requested in the resolution quoted earlier.

The Secretariat has however, studied the problem of combining the economic elements referred to in CM/Res.93(VIII) to produce a parameter which may be used to assess Member countries. The study has revealed that there is no universal agreement as to how the economic elements to be provided, can be combined to produce an acceptable parameter or measure.

The consensus appears to be that, while objections can be raised to the use of the net national product as a measure of a country's financial standing, it is as yet the most equitable measure which can be agreed upon to assess fairly the contributions of various countries.

The Secretariat will nevertheless continue to collect all the information as directed by Council and tabulate same, making any reasonable calculations or inferences for the information of the Advisory Committee and ultimately of Council. Meanwhile Council may wish to consider giving guidance as to how the various elements may be combined to provide a fair measure for the assessment of Member States.
